DID YOU KNOW?

The London Skating Club is a member of Skate Canada. In fact Skate Canada is the parent body of 1415 clubs across Canada. As you can imagine, overseeing such a large number of clubs on as one to one basis would be impossible. Therefore, Skate Canada has been divided into Sections and London is part of the Western Ontario Section (WOS). Our section is composed of 116 clubs, which have been further divided into Regions. There are 9 regions in WOS. London is a member of the HOME (Huron, Oxford, Middlesex and Elgin Counties) Region. It has 19 members and is the largest Region in WOS. The directors of all of these organizations are volunteers.

HOW TO FIND A COACH (for CanSkate or Preliminary level)

You may wish to hire a Professional Coach to provide additional instruction for your child. The

convenor of the session will be able to provide a list of coaches who are available for private lessons. It is up to you as a parent to choose the coach you feel is best suited for your skater. Your child may have enjoyed working with a particular coach during group lessons, and this good rapport is usually important to a successful coach/skater relationship. You might also talk to other skaters (or their parents) who have been taking private lessons from a coach for a while, to find out the type of teaching style that particular coach has. That might also help you decide if that coach is a good match for your child. You could also watch the coaches while they are teaching, and see if you can tell who might work well with your child. All coaches that skate with our club parents' choice as to which coach you hire, and you have to contact the coach and make arrangements directly with the coach.

It is with sadness that we learned of the death of one of our former skating club presidents, Charles Robert (Bob) Ivey. He passed away on July 24, 2003 in Unionville, On. Mr. Ivey was a member of a very prominent London family and was president of the club during the 1960's. His two sons also skated with the club during that time. Mr. Ivey was a member of the club from the late 1920's until 1941. He and his partner Ruth Shuttleworth competed in pairs at the sectional and divisional championships and were second in Canadian Pairs Championships in the early 1940's. The pair also competed in dance championships. Mr. Ivey served in the Royal Canadian Air Force during the Second World War. He returned to the club in the 1960's, and skated in the
