Fundraising

Many of you may not know that the Great Lakes Winter Skating Festival has provided the major fundraising for our club. Each year between \$15,000.00 and \$20,000.00 has been earned which helps the club in lowering the costs of all of our programs. This year this competition raised over \$35,000.00. This competition has been run my a core of 6 - 8 people, who no longer have children skating, and assisted by a large group of club volunteers. Thank you to all who have assisted over the years. Unfortunately, due to the competition restructuring by the Western Ontario Section board, this was our last Great Lakes. In the new format of competitions as laid down by the Section, the various "Regions" of the Section have been have been awarded competitions to run and share in the profit of the same.

London is a member of the HOME region and our region has been assigned Summer Sizzle - August 5 - 7 and Sectionals - November 11 - 13. These competitions will be held in Woodstock and London is in charge of Competition Registration at the site. We will have to look after the skaters signing in and giving them their credentials for both competitions. Mary Burdon is on the competition committee from the HOME region and has already been working on the competition for the last 3 months. We will need volunteers to cover the shifts each day of the competition. It is assumed that the competitions will start at 8:00 am which would mean being at the registration desk by 7:00 am. The desk would likely have to stay open until 8:00 pm daily. Please volunteer.

In addition each club in the Region is asked to sell two pages of advertising per competition. This is a good way to advertise your business as the competitors come from areas from Niagara Falls to Kitchener to Windsor and beyond. The price of a business card ad for 1 competition is \$30.00 and for both competitions is \$50.00

In answer to the question - how does the club make money on the competition? The method is as follows. The total number of volunteer hours from all is divided into the profit from the competition. As an example if 1600 hrs, was the total, the profit from the competition was \$32,000.00 and volunteers from London worked 400 hrs, the London share would be \$8,000.00; if we had only worked 40 hrs our share would only be \$800.00. As you can see, volunteers are very necessary.
