CanPowerSkate

Editor: We continue in our series explaining various aspects of Skating, what levels exist and how the level works.

CanPowerSkate is an action-packed, high energy instructional power skating program geared to hockey and ringette skaters that focuses on balance, power, agility, speed and endurance. Skills, techniques and conditioning drills are taught in a progressive format that emphasizes how the skills apply to game situations. CanPowerSkate provides an alternative to figure skating and is an excellent complement for those athletes playing on hockey or ringette teams. Its unique skill award program provides incentives and motivation for skaters to continue to achieve.

CanPowerSkate is geared to skaters aged approximately six or older who already have basic forward and backward skating skills (they must be able to skate the length of the rink using alternate strides) and are able to stop on command without use of the boards. For safety reasons participants should wear full hockey/ringette equipment that is CSA approved. The coach to skater ratio is 1:10.

CanPowerSkate's Pre-Power is designed for young skaters, approximately four to six years of age who can stand up on skates and move forward (shuffle, walk or glide) who may not be ready for CanPowerSkate Level 1. Pre-Power helps develop basic skating abilities in a power skating-specific environment, including balance skills, forward and backward skating, stopping, turning and agility skills. The curriculum is presented in three progressive levels complete with its own awards to encourage participation and motivate skaters. Pre-Power has been designed to run concurrently with CanSkate sessions.)

What are the benefits of Participating in CanPowerSkate? CanPowerSkate is the only nationally regulated power skating program in Canada. It was developed by a team of hockey, figure skating and ringette experts to teach the fundamentals of power skating in a progressive and sequential manner.

When you/your child register for a CanPowerSkate program at your local Skate Canada club, you also become a member of Skate Canada, the national sport governing body for figure skating in Canada. Membership benefits in the CanPowerSkate program can include:

- participation in a unique skill testing system which includes award bars and ribbons
- parent information sheets
- progress updates and report cards
- special CanPowerSkate events and club functions
- opportunity to be talent-scouted
- opportunity to participate in a healthy lifestyle activity



How does CanPowerSkate work? The CanPowerSkate program consists of skills divided into six levels, arranged in progressions gradually increasing in complexity. Levels 1 to 3 focus on the fundamentals of skating, Levels 4 to 6 place additional focus on the acquisition of efficient technique, speed, agility, technical aspects of stride and acceleration and skating with the puck/ring. Skaters are evaluated on skill level and are timed as they perform a test involving skills in a course-like pattern. The skater receives a mark combining his skill performance plus test time. This determines whether the skater receives a Bronze, Silver or Gold award bar for that Level.

Please note: The CanPowerSkate program is exclusive to Skate Canada and is available only to Skate Canada member clubs and sanctioned skating schools. All participants must be registered with Skate Canada. Only Skate Canada member Coaches trained and certified at a CanPowerSkate Coaches Course are qualified to instruct the CanPowerSkate program.

Other junior members in the show included Francis Hall, Pamela Perkins, Brenda Wong, Roy Moore, Billy Dunning, Bonnie Galbraith, Carol Ann Clipperton, Diane Pollock, Catherine Rathburn, Dianne Beninger, Leslie Betts and Walter Blackburn Jr. Evelyn Bestow, a longtime member of the club who skated in the senior numbers recalls "This was the first show we had put on since early in World War 2. The club had been revived by Mrs. Charles Ivey in 1949 when artificial ice became available in the Ontario Arena at the Western Fair Grounds. Mrs. Ivey was a very good skater and an excellent organizer. Mrs. Bradley Granger (Sara's mother) who had been a Canadian Pairs Champion was a leading Member. Mrs. John Labatt was a very active member and she would have one of her servants bring refreshments and service them to the adult skaters. Many of the influential old London families belonged to the skating club. George Becher Harris founded the club at Eldon house in 1907 and Amelia was also a founding member and who skated in the club until the early forties. She also founded a woman's hockey team in the 1890's. Fancy Dress Carnivals were popular at the time and they skated at the Princess Rink located on the former Public Library site on Queens Avenue. Today the club uses the Nichols Arena as a headquarters and the adult skaters continue to enjoy the facilities at Thompson arena on the UWO campus.
